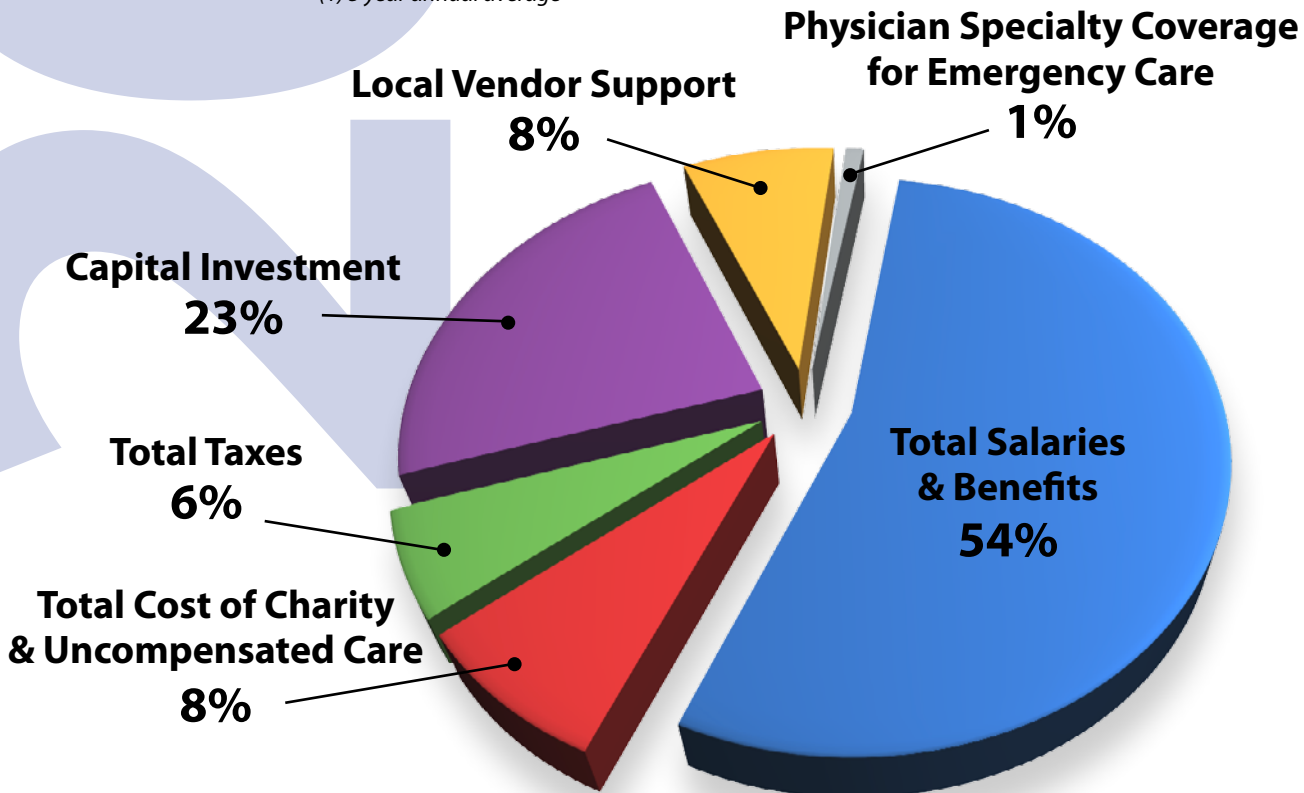

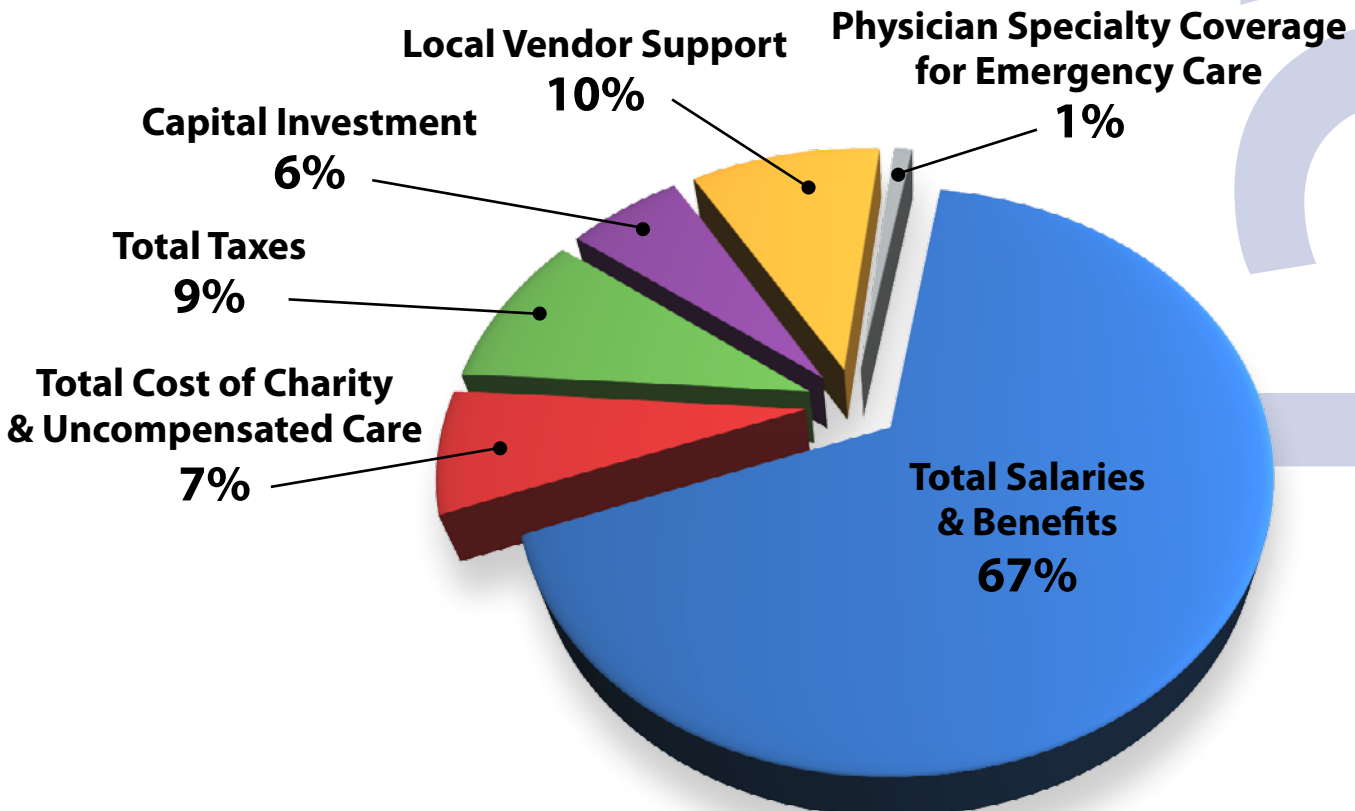

### Community Support

### Step Up for Students

Since 2005, HCA has redirected corporate income tax to the Step Up for Students program. Through this gift, low income students received a K-12 scholarship enabling them to receive a quality education tailored for their specific needs. Through this program, children who qualify for the National School Lunch Program can receive scholarships. Qualifying parents can use these grants to send their child to the public or private school that best meets their child's needs.

Community Hospital has 12 chronic care management programs which have earned the Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval for health care quality. 5 are the first for Florida and one the first in the Nation. Only one other hospital in the State of Florida has earned 12 certifications.

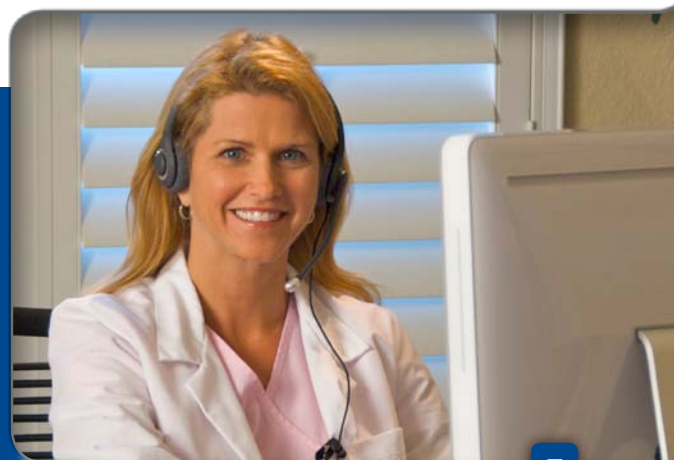
Regional Medical Center Bayonet Point is the first hospital in Florida to earn the Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval in Advanced Certification for Heart Failure and is recognized with the Get With The Guidelines Silver Plus Performance Award and the American Heart Association's Get With The Guidelines Triple Performance Awards for Coronary Artery Disease, Heart Failure and Stroke. Community Hospital, Oak Hill Hospital and Regional Medical Center Bayonet Point have all received the American Heart Association's Fit-Friendly Company – Gold Award.

## Hurricane Preparedness

HCA West Florida offers one of the most comprehensive hurricane preparedness plans to ensure that our patients and our staff who care for them are safe before, during and after a storm. Our Division has arrangements and contracts in place with vendors from around the state and nation to provide support, from on-site security if needed to medical supplies, additional generators, food, fuel, emergency transportation, building supplies and construction crews who can be dispatched immediately following the storm to make needed repairs to keep our hospitals operational.

Registered Nurses are available for consultation through this bi-lingual community service, which also registers people for the numerous community education classes and programs sponsored by the HCA hospitals of Central and West Florida.



## QUALITY & PATIENT SAFETY

"Putting Patients First" is the foundation of our culture and passion for quality health care. Many of the initiatives we implement serve as national models for the industry today.

### hCare Electronic Health Record (EHR)

The West Florida Division has invested heavily in its Electronic Health Record (EHR) initiative, which kicks off in March 2010. Throughout 2009, many projects related to the development and implementation of EHR were rolled out in preparation. With EHR, access to patient health information is simplified and patient safety and quality are improved. Our hospitals have brought numerous clinical components for the EHR on-line through major investments in technology.

### hCare Hub

As more and more physician practices begin using Electronic Medical Record (EMR) systems, there is an increased need to integrate data from a variety of clinical systems, including hospital systems. Linking physician practices to our hospital data bases is now being rolled out through the hCare Hub interface. This allows physician offices real-time access to patient clinical data from the hospital. Effective clinical data exchange can provide necessary information to physicians to make timely decisions and reduce duplicate testing and unnecessary hospitalizations.



### Picture Archiving and Communications System (PACS)

The PACS system immediately digitizes images such as Xrays, and other scans including CT, MRI and PET, so they can be stored and electronically viewed on screens anywhere. This enables doctors and other health care professionals to access the images, even remotely, and to compare new images with previous images at the touch of a button.

### Voice Recognition

To improve report turnaround time and patient care, our hospitals and imaging centers use Voice Recognition which allows Radiologists to report their interpretation of a study directly from the PACS Imaging system by speaking instead of dictating. The physician then reviews the report on screen, makes any adjustments, signs the report and it posts immediately for others to view. Report turnaround time has been greatly reduced to an average of just over 30 minutes.

### MUSE

Our hospitals have installed this system which digitizes EKG tracings so physicians can review the tracings and be able to diagnose and treat heart patients within seconds.

### Electronic Medication Bar Coding System (eMAR)

We led a national effort to reduce medication errors by placing this system in all of our hospitals. Bar codes on medications are scanned at the patient's bedside, providing our clinical staff with an effective tool to ensure that the right patient receives the right medication at the right time through the right route.

## Unprecedented Flu Season Preparation

The National Patient Safety Foundation has recognized all HCA employees for their efforts in supporting HCA's flu immunization policy. Whatever the 2009/2010 flu season brings, HCA employees have prepared well. Our hospitals stepped up efforts to encourage employees to take advantage of our free flu vaccine program and practice good hygiene. More than 97 percent of our employees have received the flu vaccine, an amazing accomplishment which helps protect our patients as well as our employees and their families. Additionally, many of our hospitals actively participate in community outreach efforts to educate the public about the importance of seasonal flu vaccine and the H1N1 vaccine.

## Nation's First Infant Screening Program

We were the first US healthcare system to voluntarily perform a simple blood test to screen newborns for elevated levels of bilirubin that triggers jaundice. By identifying newborns at risk for Kernicterus, which causes permanent brain damage and physical impairment, we can treat them immediately and prevent this serious health threat.



## Methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA)

HCA continues to be a leader in the fight to stop the spread of MRSA, and was invited to participate as a partner organization in the REDUCE MRSA Clinical Trial, with the CDC Prevention Epicenters, CDC Division of Healthcare Quality Promotion and the Agency for Healthcare Quality and Research (AHRQ). HCA was selected due to its commitment to infection prevention, the HCA A, B, Cs (MRSA) program and our standardization of specific lab data. The goal of the study is to conduct a cluster randomized trial of hospitals to compare uniform versus target MRSA decolonization as a means to reduce healthcare-associated MRSA infection. Eight HCA West Florida Division hospitals are participating.

We continue to be very involved in educational outreach to prevent the spread of community acquired MRSA. The national Clean Hands Are Cool Hands campaign, featuring teen star Mitchel Musso (Hannah Montana show), was launched here in 2008 and participation extended throughout 2009, with our partner schools. The goal is to educate children on the prevention of MRSA, through local presentations and a tool kit for parents and teachers which is available on our hospital websites.



## Medical Education

We are helping educate future healthcare workers through partnerships with local colleges and on-site mentoring and training in the fields of nursing, radiology, phlebotomy, information systems, physical therapy, social work, anesthesia assistants and emergency medical services.

## Medical Research

We work with our physician partners and other organizations who engage in research and clinical trial initiatives. These studies have included cardiac, orthopedics, cancer and infection control.

## SPECIALIZED CARE

### Emergency Excellence

Our excellence in Emergency Care offers state-of-the-art technology for the communities we serve.

- As a part of our long term commitment to producing high quality results for our patients, our highly skilled emergency healthcare teams include board certified physicians, physician assistants, and nurses. By employing protocol driven care that can begin in the field through direct communications with local EMS teams and meeting stringent standards, combined with best practices, we have earned the title of Accredited Chest Pain Center by The Society of Chest Pain Centers and Certified Primary Stroke Center by the Joint Commission
- Oak Hill Hospital was selected by the Board of Certification for Emergency Nursing (BCEN®) Board of Directors as the recipient of the 2009 BCEN® Honorary Recognition Award. 100% of Oak Hill Emergency Room Nurses are BCEN certified. **The BCEN® Honorary Recognition Award is a national award given to only one emergency room a year by the BCEN®**
- Our focus on improving ER programs by working tirelessly to earn accreditations and reducing the time patients spend waiting to see a qualified medical provider has resulted in dramatically reduced wait times which are below national averages. **You can find our ER wait times on billboards, by logging on to all hospital web sites, or by texting ER to 23000**



### Heart & Vascular Care

Our cardiovascular network ensures that life-saving technology and the very latest minimally invasive techniques are available in the communities we serve.

- The Heart Institutes at Oak Hill Hospital and Regional Medical Center Bayonet Point offer the latest surgical techniques for shorter stays and better outcomes
- Chest Pain Centers accredited by the Society for Chest Pain Centers (with PCI at Oak Hill Hospital and Regional Medical Center Bayonet Point)
- Our hospitals consistently beat the national STEMI benchmark of 90 minutes from patient arrival to the re-establishment of blood flow to the heart
- We offer Cardiac Catheterization and Electrophysiology (Cardiac Arrhythmia) labs with state-of-the-art technology & treatment for invasive and non-invasive cardiac procedures
- All of our Emergency Departments rapidly assess and diagnose patients with chest pain without having to be admitted to the facility
- Procedures to treat specialized minimally invasive mitral valve disease and atrial fibrillation provide a safer alternative for patients with chronic heart conditions
- We are dedicated to improving the patient's quality of life and reducing risk for other serious complications

## Neurosciences & Stroke Care

Our hospitals have earned Joint Commission Primary Stroke Center designation, the gold standard for ensuring the highest level of care is immediately available.

Supported by highly skilled specialists to achieve certification, our physicians are joined by surgeons, neurologists, nurses, rehabilitative therapists, laboratory and pharmacy staff, and radiologists who are specially trained to respond quickly and completely to the needs of a stroke patient. Each patient is evaluated and treated using a uniform and extensive set of guidelines that address both emergency treatment and ongoing care.

## Comprehensive Cancer Care

Cancer continues to be the second leading cause of death in this country. Our hospitals are committed to meet and exceed the numerous standards required for the American College of Surgeon's Commission on Cancer (ACoS CoC).

The essential elements our hospitals offer as fully accredited cancer programs with:

- State-of-the-art pretreatment evaluation, staging, treatment and clinical follow-up for cancer patients seen at the facility for primary, secondary or tertiary care
- Active cancer committee that leads the program through setting goals, monitoring activity, evaluating patient outcomes, implementing community outreach programs and improving care
- Cancer conferences that provide a forum for patient consultation and contribute to physician education
- Quality improvement programs that are the mechanism for evaluating and improving patient outcomes
- Cancer registry and database that is the basis for monitoring the quality of care

## Orthopedic and Spine Care

Patients needing advanced treatments for orthopedic and spine issues can find high quality care at our hospitals. A partial list of treatment options available include:
